3. Kindness is Good _____

Read: Luke 10:25-37

- a. The Priest. His duties: serve in the temple and offer prayers and sacrifices to God for the people. Did he help?
- b. The Levite. His duties: a priest's assistant and took care of the temple. Did he help?

Discussion Question: Why do you think the Priest and Levite did not show kindness to the man?

Notice: the Samaritan moved *toward* the injured man (vs. 34 - "went to him") just like Jesus moves *toward* us. Jesus comes to you to build a relationship.

- b. Don't be _____ to criticize or _____ people (don't assume to know the details of their background)
- c. Share your resources (time, supplies, energy, finances)

Three attitudes displayed:

- Robbers: What's yours is mine and I'm going to take it.
- Priest/Levite: What's mine is mine and I'm going to keep it.
- Samaritan: What's mine is your and I'm going to share it.

Consider: Which person in the Good Samaritan parable is like most like you?

4. How did God show his kindness to us?

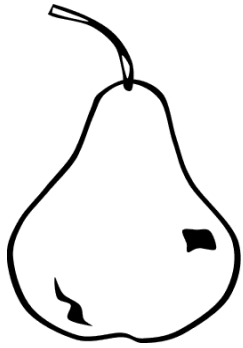

Discussion Question: Did we earn God's kindness?

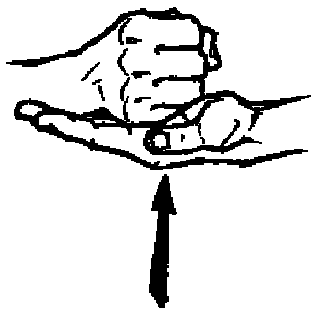
GOLD NUGGET

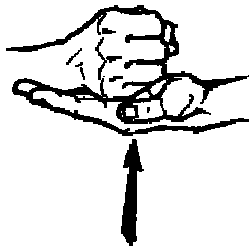
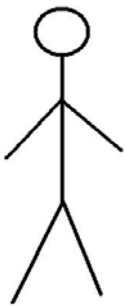
Application: Ask God to place kindness and mercy in your heart this week. Make the effort to help someone this week; someone you don't know very well.



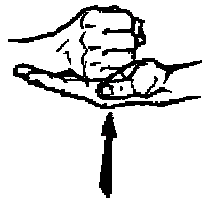
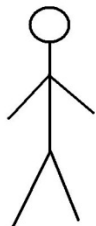
